

## **PONDER**

Read and meditate on 1 Peter 2:9-10. Consider your own life. What changes have you seen in your life since you have been brought into God's marvelous light? Consider how you can share your story to communicate the gospel to others.

If you have never experienced this change in your life, pray that the Lord would do this in your life today. Ask Him to reveal the things in your life that hold you back from completely surrendering to Him.

Also, read and meditate on Matthew 6:7-8. Our worship is motivated by something at all times, and God knows that motivation always. What motivates your worship? Are you like the Gentiles whose motivation is centered around making themselves look good or righteous? Our worship is not supposed to be man-centered, but God-centered to bring him glory because of who He is and not because of who we are.

## **PRAY**

Pray today that the Lord would reveal to you the ways that you are tempted to live for your own kingdom rather than His Kingdom. Confess the things that you hold on to that distract you from your pursuit of Christ, surrender those things to Him, and thank the Lord for His continual grace to pursue you.

Pray that the things that the Lord has shown you at Impact would go beyond the weekend and that God would continue to change lives through the gospel of His glorious grace. Commit to live for His Kingdom over your own, and pray for boldness to that end.

## **PRACTICE**

As you pray, think of every circle of influence that you have. This can be your school, family, sports, clubs, and more. Make a list of people in each of those circles who do not know Jesus, and make an intentional plan for how you can share the gospel with those people.

Share your list with a leader or someone in your group, and ask them to hold you accountable to being bold to share the gospel with them. If Jesus is our King, we will live for His Kingdom, which means that we will be bold to proclaim the gospel to those who are dead in their sins, even if that means sacrificing ourselves, our comfort, or our friendships.
